## GRAMMAR

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### Mixed Conditionals: Past → Present

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#### Multiple Choice

1. c

'would be' — mixed conditional links past unreal action (had studied) to present result (would be).

2. c

'hadn't had' — mixed conditional links present condition (implied ongoing distractions) to past result (would have finished).

3. a

'had ignored' — mixed conditional links past unreal action (had ignored) to present result (would be stuck).

4. c

'would be / had quit' — mixed conditional: present result (would be) from past unreal action (had quit). Note: full form shown for clarity, but blank tests the key mixed tense.

5. c

'had had' — mixed conditional links past unreal action (had had better teamwork) to present result (would be).

## Passive: Present Perfect

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### Multiple Choice

**1. a**

'has been' — present perfect passive with 'already' for an action completed at an unspecified time before now with present relevance.

**2. a**

'have been' — present perfect passive required with 'recently'; note plural subject requires 'have'.

**3. a**

'haven't been' — present perfect passive negative form used with 'yet' to indicate something not completed up to now.

**4. a**

'has been' — present perfect passive with 'since' to show actions starting in the past and continuing relevance now.

**5. b**

'has been' — present perfect passive with 'yet' emphasizing lack of completion before now.

## Wish/If only: Regrets & Hypotheticals

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### Sentence Transformation

**1. I wish I had travelled more.**

**2. I wish she lived closer.**

**3. I wish my colleague wouldn't interrupt me.**
